## **"Stones, Rocks and High Places: What can the ancient shrines preserved on our hillsides teach us today?"**



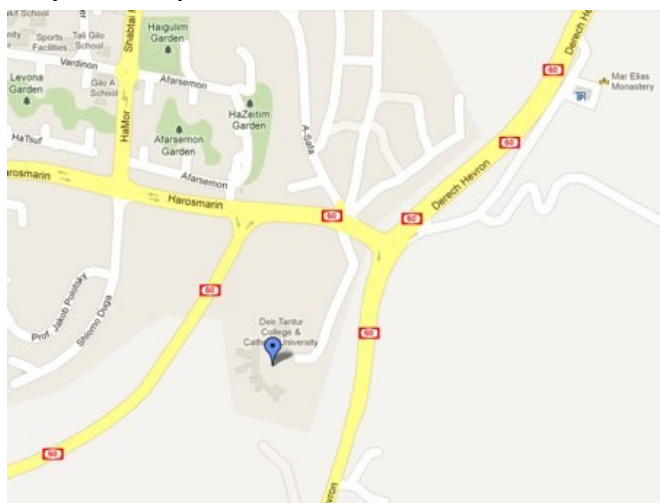
### **About Dr. Ali Qleibo**

Dr. Qleibo is an artist, author, and anthropologist. Born in Jerusalem and educated in the United States, his books and artwork have taken him all over the world. Dr. Qleibo has lectured at Al Quds University, teaching ancient classical civilisation. He was former Director of Cultural Studies Programme at Al-Quds University Fellowship at Shalom Hartman Institute; Director of Department of Fine Arts at Al-Quds University; Visiting Professor at Tokyo University for Foreign Studies, Japan; and former Assistant Professor at Birzeit University. At The Jerusalem Research center Dr. Qleibo developed the Muslim tourism itinerary in Jerusalem encompassing tangible and intangible heritage. He is a specialist in Palestinian social history. He has authored various books such as *Surviving the Wall*, *Before the Mountains Disappear*.

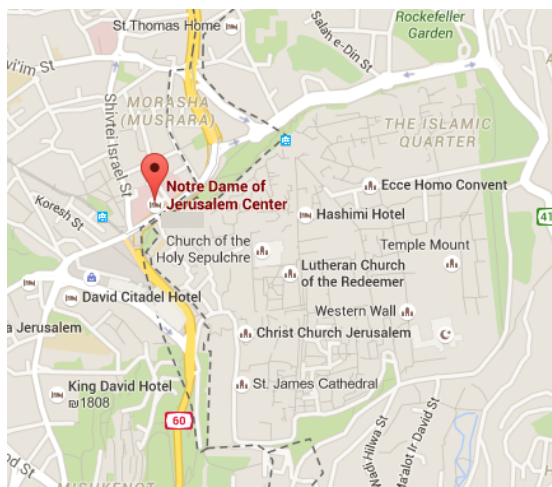
